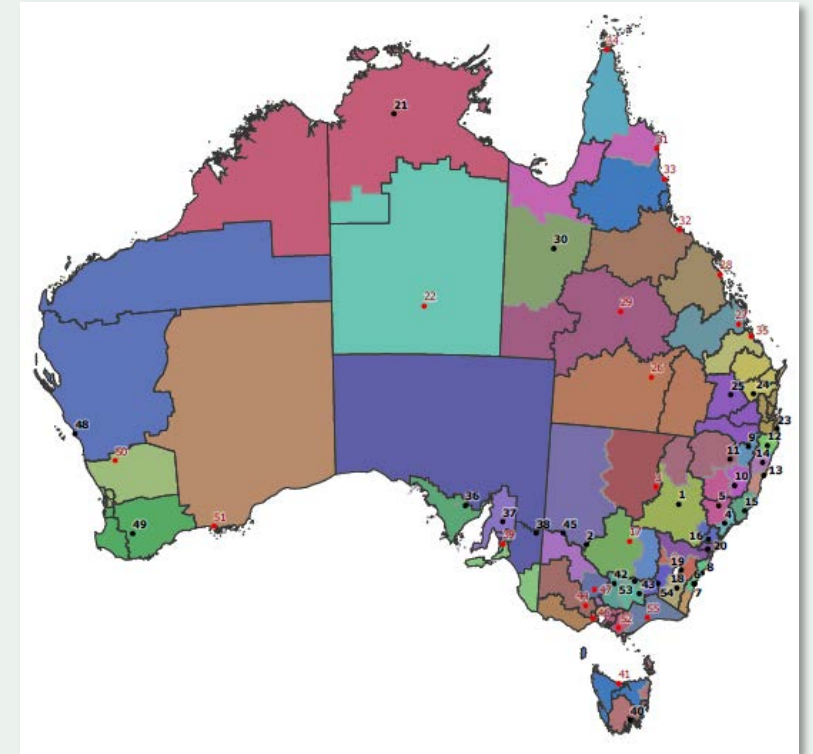
OUR PURPOSE

RECOVERY SUPPORT OFFICER NETWORK

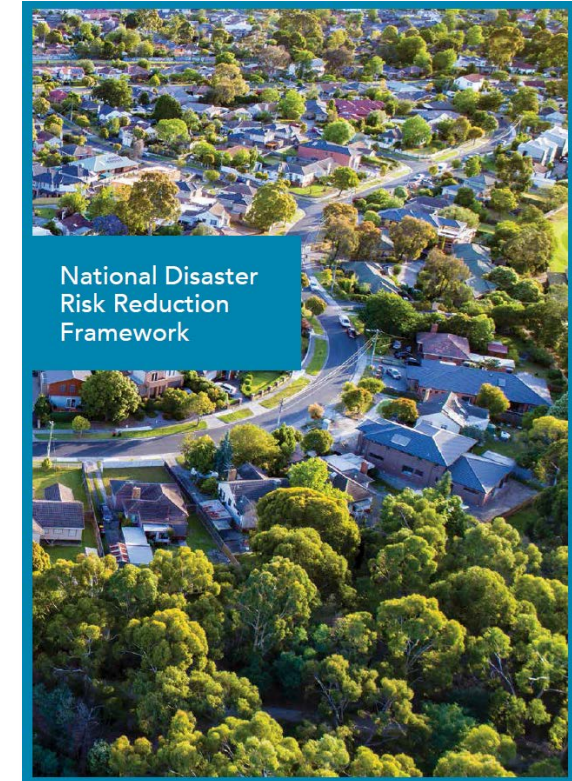
- Local Recovery Support Officers (RSOs) provide a direct and trusted ‘voice from the ground’ to the Australian Government.
- **40 RSOs** nationally.

The National Disaster Risk Reduction Framework established a strategic foundation for reform

- Created to shift the national conversation on natural hazards and disaster impacts.
- Establishes the strategic foundation required to drive systemic change to:
 - reduce existing risk
 - prevent new risk being created; and
 - build resilience.
- Aligns to the international *Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction 2015 –2030*.
- Progressing the priority areas of the Framework is currently driven through National Action Plans.



The Second National Action Plan will be forward-looking and drive change

OUR APPROACH

- We will draw on learnings and feedback to be more strategic and forward looking.
- The plan will:
 - be action-oriented
 - plan how to get to where we need to be
 - provide focus to high-priority areas
 - highlight connections across the system
 - provide useful examples to support action
 - imagine how the future could look.
